

Decennial Review

Work is actively underway on our decennial (ten-year) review. We are not reviewing our individual programmes but are looking at testing our model of change and setting an appropriate level of future spending. We are also looking at ways of illustrating the impact of the work that we fund.

Thank you to everyone who responded to our survey in February to help us understand the changing context of your work and ours. Thank you also to those who expressed a willingness to take part in a follow up conversation; we've not been able to take up all offers, but our consultant has spoken to a number of groups, and this has proved very useful. We are feeding insights from the survey and follow up into our discussions.

We have also recruited a postgraduate intern, Gregory Ineson, from the University of York to analyse the impact of a sample of our funding over the past ten years. Our impact film training workshop received strong interest. It will be taking place towards the end of May.

We expect to conclude the main part of the decennial review in September, and hope to be ready to share some news about the outcomes by the end of the year.
